

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The Socorro Water System has a level of Arsenic above Drinking Water Standards for the third quarter of 2009

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results from quarterly arsenic samples collected on November 5, 2008, January 29, 2009, April 20, 2009 and July 27, 2009 shows that Springs Entry Point, School of Mines Well and South Industrial Well exceed the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for arsenic. The current running annual average for arsenic is 0.036 mg/L. The standard for arsenic is 0.010 mg/L or 10 parts per billion (ppb). Therefore, the Socorro Water System has exceeded the arsenic MCL in the third quarter of 2009 (July - September 2009).

What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, or have a compromised immune system you may consult your doctor or drink and use bottled water.

What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with their circulatory system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

What Happened? What is being done?

The arsenic in our water is from erosion of natural deposits. The Socorro Water System will continue to post this arsenic public notice every 3 months as long as this MCL exceedence persists. We are also exploring options that will reduce the arsenic level in our water to a level that is under the MCL.
